### Reflections of Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

12 years before his death in 1956, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. stood in the pulpit of Good Street Baptist Church at 902 Good Latimer and blessed the members by preaching God's word. It was a blessing to all who were there.

A few interesting facts about Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King

At 6 years old Dr. King's father changed his name from Michael King, Jr. to Martin Luther King, Jr. He skipped two grades in high school, the 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grades, and entered Morehouse College at the age of 15. Dr. King became a minister when he was 18 years old at his father's church Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. He was called to Pastor in 1954 when he was 25 years old at Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama. Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech delivered in 1963 in Washington D.C. was ranked as the top speech of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. He was the youngest male to win a Nobel Peace Prize at the age of 35 in 1964. Dr. King's non-violent civil rights work led to the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. He donated all of the \$54,123 from winning the Nobel Peace Prize to the Civil Rights Movement. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day didn't become a federal holiday until 1986, nearly 20 years after it was introduced to Congress, it faced an upward battle for all states to recognize the holiday, only getting nationally recognized in 2000. However, the first MLK holiday was celebrated on January 20, 1986. The "I Have a Dream" speech was largely improvised and was witnessed by \$250,000 people. Over 700 Streets in the United States are named after Dr. King.

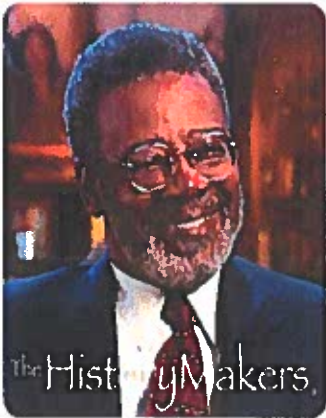
### CARDIAC ARREST

What is cardiac arrest, and why are CPR and AED so important? Cardiac arrest is when the heart stops abruptly with little or no warning. Early recognition of cardiac arrest symptoms (Person becomes unresponsive, is not breathing, or is only gasping) improves the person's chance of survival and is key to starting the correct care of CPR and the appropriate use of defibrillation to restart the heart. CPR can help keep the heart pumping and blood flowing to vital organs until an electrical shock from a defibrillator is available to restore the heart to a normal heart rhythm.
